A 13 year-old Dutch Jewish girl records her impressions of the two years she and seven others spent hiding from the Nazis before they were discovered and taken to concentration camps. Includes entries previously omitted.

FRA Rol, Ruud van der Anne Frank, beyond the diary: a photographic remembrance. Viking. 1993. Photographs, illustrations, and maps accompany historical essays, diary excerpts, and interviews, providing an insight to Anne Frank and the massive upheaval which tore apart her world. (Task #4)
